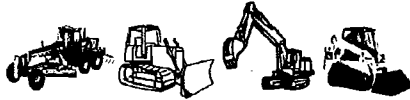

Village of Big Valley News - June 25, 2025

Village Council met on June 23rd, 2025 at their Regular Council Meeting which had been rescheduled from June 16th.

Contractor Eddie Shepell with Spectre Systems, located in Lougheed, AB introduced himself and services available to municipalities and private residents.

In reference to this year's Capital Budget, 4th Avenue between 2nd and 3rd Street has been designated as a roadworks priority for 2025. Mayor Janke has called for a Special Meeting to be held July 7th to approve a sealed tender document encompassing an invitation to tender, instructions to tenderers, with detailed specifications to be sent to interested contractors. Submissions received by the closing date will be opened and reviewed by council at the July 21st regular meeting.

The Village will continue their crack filling program this summer, with the contractor expected in the next few weeks, weather permitting. As a result of weather conditions in 2023, the sidewalk outside of the Post Office was delayed, and has been rescheduled to be completed this summer. In addition, the grading of back alleys is in the process of being scheduled.

Alberta Prairie Railway will be holding their annual Live Steam, Vintage Equipment and Antique Car Show on the weekend of July 12th & 13th, with the Big Valley Street Festival scheduled for the following weekend on Saturday, July 19th.

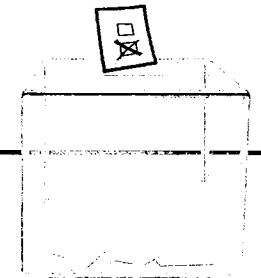
